### TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS + EXPENSES

The cost of the 2025 Dodd Cortona Experience is \$2,500 per person, which may fluctuate slightly based on final group size and exchange rate at the time of travel. In addition to the registration payment, we are asking for a tax-deductible, non-refundable gift of \$1,000 per individual (\$1,500 for couples) to the Lamar Dodd School of Art and UGA Cortona to ensure the continuation of quality visual arts education and programming at home and abroad.

The cost of the Dodd Cortona Experience covers tuition, fees, some art supplies, receptions, most dinners, occasional lunches, museum entrances, wine tastings, other cultural/educational experiences, art demonstrations, guest lectures, ground transportation on field trips and group excursions.
